Imagine being out in the woods with nothing but a compass. Along the way, your journey may take some twists and turns around mountains and rivers, but ultimately, your compass continually guides you.

So when we think about our lives of faith, what guides and orients us? Though we may be inclined to offer the Sunday School answer of “God” or “Jesus,” many things have the potential to form what we believe and how we live our lives of faith.

In this course, we’ll embark on a journey to assess (and re-assess) what we hold as central to our Christian faith. And together, we’ll accompany one another as we learn (and re-learn) how what we believe impacts our lives, society around us, and the church.

## **Wayfinders is a group that will...**

- explore the foundations of the Christian faith, moving beyond a “Sunday School” answer to a framework that honors the complexity of our lives and faith
- discuss key concepts within Scripture and our Christian tradition. Examples may include: sin, salvation, Kingdom of God, heaven/hell
- reinforce a foundation of faith to gain confidence in articulating what we believe and why we believe it to be true
- explore how what we believe impacts our practice of Christianity in society, the church, and our personal lives, exploring topics such as: politics and civic responsibility, sexuality, world religions, ecumenicism, etc.
